# **Prayer of Thanksgiving (cont.)**

Lord, you are holy indeed, the fountain of all holiness. Let your Spirit come upon these gifts to make them holy, so that they may become for us the body + and blood of our Savior Jesus Christ.

Blessed are you O God, and forever blessed are the people of this world since you chose to break into our history in the person of Jesus Christ. He made your extravagant love visible in and through all he said and did, especially on the night when he washed his disciples' feet. When he sat down to share the meal with them...

He took bread and gave you thanks and praise; he broke the bread, gave it to those gathered around him, and said: Take this, all of you, and eat it: This is my body, which will be given up for you.

When supper was ended, he took the cup; again he gave you thanks and praise, he gave the cup to his disciples, and said: Take this all of you and drink from it. This is the cup of my blood, the blood of the new and everlasting covenant. It will be shed for you and for all so that sins may be forgiven. Do this in memory of me.

**Concelebrant** In memory of his death and resurrection, we offer you, holy God, this life-giving bread, this saving cup. We thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you. May all of us who share in the body and blood of Christ be brought together in unity by the Holy Spirit. Great is the mystery of faith. **Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.** 

Lord, remember your Church throughout the world; make us grow in love, together with Rafe our bishop and all your faithful people who love and serve you. Remember our loved ones who have gone to their rest in the hope of rising again; bring them and all the departed into the light of your presence. Have mercy on us all; make us worthy to share eternal life with Mary, the Mother of God, Joseph her husband, the apostles, and all the saints and ancestors who have done your will throughout the ages. May we praise you in union with them, and give you glory through your son Jesus Christ. For we believe that it is: **Through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, almighty God, forever and ever.** 

Presider Let us pray the prayer that Jesus taught us: Our Father...

Lord, in the power of your Spirit make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world.

This is the table not of the Church but of the Christ, and all are welcome.... We come, because it is Christ's will that we meet him here. For this is the bread of life and the cup of salvation, and we, though many, are one body, for we al share in the one bread and the one cup. Amen.
