

Opening Prayer



Prayer of Thanksgiving

The Lord be with you. And also with you. Lift up your hearts. We lift them up to the Lord. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give God thanks and praise

Almighty and ever-living God, we do well always and everywhere to give you thanks. In wonder of your expansive embrace, we give you praise, O God. Through your radical welcome, you reveal the limitations of our own imaginations. You break down walls and boundaries we don't even realize we have erected.

Like the magi guided by the light of star through foreign territory, you call us all towards you. You lead your people across borders of hate and into lands of curious and different. Concelebrant: Lord, you are holy indeed, the fountain of all holiness. Let your Spirit come upon these gifts to make them holy, so that they may become for us the body + and blood of our Savior Jesus Christ.

Before he was given up to death, a death he freely accepted,

He took bread and gave you thanks and praise; he broke the bread, gave it to those gathered around him, and said: Take this, all of you, and eat it: This is my body, which will be given up for you.

When supper was ended, he took the cup; again he gave you thanks and praise, he gave the cup to his disciples, and said: Take this all of you and drink from it. This is the cup of my blood, the blood of the new and everlasting covenant. It will be shed for you and for all so that sins may be forgiven. Do this in memory of me.

Prayer of Thanksgiving (cont.)

In memory of his death and resurrection, we offer you, holy God, this life-giving bread, this saving cup. We thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you. May all of us who share in the body and blood of Christ be brought together in unity by the Holy Spirit. Great is the mystery of faith.

Presider: Lord, remember your Church throughout the world; make us grow in love, together with Pablo our presiding bishop and all your faithful people who love and serve you. Remember our loved ones who have gone to their rest in the hope of rising again; bring them and all the departed into the light of your presence. Have mercy on us all; make us worthy to share eternal life with Mary, the Mother of God, Joseph her husband, the apostles, and all the saints and ancestors who have done your will throughout the ages. May we praise you in union with them, and give you glory through your son Jesus Christ. For we believe that it is: **Through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, almighty God, forever and ever.**

Let us pray for the coming of the kingdom as Jesus taught us:

Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done






