Christ lives in your Shalom, and calls us to live in peace and understanding, as well.



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As we remember Christ's life and ministry, as we follow him through death into the resurrection of the new life, we proclaim that mystery of our faith: **Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.**

No less than at the river Jordan, pour out your Holy Spirit upon us, O God, and upon these gifts of bread and wine, that they may be the life of Christ for us. For it is **through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, almighty God, forever and ever. Amen.**

Celebrant At your table, fill us with the bread of forgiveness and with the cup of hope. Flow through us like baptismal waters, so we might become a river of reconciliation. Help us live the prayer that Jesus taught us: **Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.
